What Did We Accomplish In 2022?

Treasurer's Report:

Our Treasurer, Jim McLane reports the following numbers as of December 31, 2022. The Battle Born Patriots Chapter ended the year with a net worth of \$6,647.30. Of that amount \$3,316.11 was restricted for use by Color Guard, and the balance of \$3,331.19 is unrestricted. There are no liabilities. Total income for the year was \$4,749.81 and total expenses for the year was \$6,027.16. The reason for the difference in income vs. expenses is a \$1,500 deposit we made to the Atlantis for an event that was cancelled. The deposit was rolled over into 2023 and will be offset by revenue from the Annual Meeting scheduled for April 1.

Montevallo's American Village hosts re-enactments from colonial and revolutionary war times, featuring prominent historical figures like George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, and Abigail Adams. Liberty Village, at the Balance of Nature world campus in Hurricane, will be a similar facility that will teach American history from its original perspective to children and families.


